1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Overview

Rufus Ousler Hart, the son of Alexander Pickens Hart and Mary Elizabeth Bradley, is fairly well documented in the late 19th and early 20th century records of Randolph County, West Virginia. Those record sources, however, reveal significant conflicts in his date and place of birth. This assignment analyzes those sources in an attempt to resolve the conflicts and clarify his birth date and birth place, as well as other vital information.

1.2 Summary of Record Sources

The following record sources containing vital information about Rufus O. Hart were used in this classification exercise:

2.2 Birth Date Analysis

Record sources for Rufus O. Hart suggest four potential birth dates:

- 08 November 1869
- 07 November 1870
- 07 April 1871
- November 1871

The 1870 and 1871 dates are supported by evidence from multiple sources. The 1869 birth date is recorded solely on Rufus' death certificate. Although the informant is reported to be John Hart, his son, a closer examination of the death certificate suggests more than one informant.

The birth month and birth day are typed, while the birth year is handwritten. The "age in years" is typed, while the "age in months" and "age in days" is handwritten. This indicates that the original informant knew only some of the information at the time the death certificate was created and the rest of the information was appended later. Therefore, the informant is undetermined for the birth date and age information on the death certificate. Due to the unknown source of this information, its inconsistencies with other records (including the death register and gravestone), and its lack of additional support, the 1869 birth date is not credible. Also, Rufus' sister, Mabel, was born 24 February 1869, 13 making an early November 1869 birth date for him exceedingly unlikely. For the foregoing reasons, the 1869 birth date is rejected.

The November 1871 birth month/year is stated explicitly in the 1900 census¹⁴ by an undetermined informant, but most likely Rufus' wife. Rufus' sister, Bertha, was born in February 1872,¹⁵ making a November 1871 birth date for Rufus impossible, thus the November 1871 birth date is rejected.

That leaves 07 November 1870 and 07 April 1871 as plausible candidates for Rufus' date of birth. Both are supported by the 1880 and 1910 U.S. census records, 16 where a calculated birth date range based on reported age at the time of enumeration encompasses both dates.

The November 1870 birth date is additionally supported by the death register, his marriage record, the gravestone, and two authored narratives, ¹⁷ all providing secondary or undetermined information.

The April 1871 birth date is additionally supported by the birth register and the 1920 census calculated birth date range. ¹⁸ In general, records created closer to the time of the event are likely

to be more accurate than those created later, with an original birth register typically offering the highest quality of primary, direct information for a birth date. Thus the birth register's date of 07 April 1871 should trump the other date. However, this particular birth register is not an original record of primary information and requires a closer examination.

The Randolph County Birth Register

The birth register for Randolph County, West Virginia for this period of time is not a typical birth register. The births are not in chronological order. They are sequenced by year, district, and then roughly alphabetical order by the first letter of the surname. This establishes that the information in the register was copied from another source, making the birth register a derivative record. The register contains all the detailed information typically recorded for a birth, so it is not an index.

Further inspection of the birth register pages for several years surrounding 1870 reveals a few clues that may explain how these records were created. The top of each page or district section begins with, "Births in District No. N in the County of Randolph" often followed by a person's name and the word "asesor" [sic]. At the end of the annual list of births for many of the years there is a signature; for example, "Teste – James D Wilson, Clerk". The word *teste* used in this context means "to bear witness" and indicates the official nature of the recording. This suggests that the local assessors documented the births in their own districts and these births were later copied by the clerk from the assessors' records into the county birth register. Therefore, this birth register is a derivative record containing undetermined information.

The quality of the information in the birth register may be further questioned because the data was hand copied, birth by birth, into the county ledger book from other documents, with the potential for errors and omissions that such copying may incur. Could a birth date of 07 November 1870 be inadvertently transcribed as 07 April 1871? When copying many records into an alphabetical format it is conceivable for a clerk to accidentally record the birth month of one child for the next child, perhaps writing "April" instead of "November". But it would be unlikely for him to accidentally enter a birth from the year 1870 into the birth register pages for 1871; pages which presumably didn't yet exist at that time. To test for the possibility that the clerk inadvertently wrote the year "1871" on the top of the page instead of "1870," two other people with births on the same page as Rufus were tracked in later records. Both analyses confirmed the birth year of 1871 on the register page as correct.

Analysis of Secondary and Undetermined information

The lack of primary information for the birth date of Rufus Hart makes it difficult to reach a conclusion about which of the two potential dates, 07 November 1870 or 07 April 1871, is his birth date. Since both dates are based wholly on secondary or undetermined information, it may be helpful to gain an understanding of where that information may have originated.

Some of the census records support both dates because the calculated date range is so broad. For this reason, the census records will be disregarded and the focus will be on the other sources.

Records supporting the 1870 birth date:

- The February 1898 marriage record²⁰ the informant for this record, the bride, Lucy Logan, asserted Rufus' age as 27.
- The death register,²¹ with his son John as informant
- The gravestone,²² informant unknown
- Pioneer Index Randolph County²³
- *The Harts of Randolph*²⁴

The latter two sources are authored narratives. The author of *The Harts of Randolph* is Katherine Hart Frame, the daughter of Rufus, who presumably obtained her father's birth date from her father or mother, making this a more credible source than most authored narratives. The author of *Pioneer Index Randolph County* obtained the birth date from the gravestone, thus it is not a source of independent origin and can be discounted as a source providing additional support.

The 1870 birth date is reported across several decades of records by multiple informants. Does this mean it is correct, or is it simply wrong information that has been perpetuated by family lore?

Records supporting the 1871 birth date:

The main record providing support for the 1871 birth date is the birth register for Rufus Hart.²⁵ Although it is a derivative record, it is the record closest in time to the actual birth. Despite the potential for copying errors by the clerk, this information is not based on hearsay, but on official documentation from the local assessors. Then why does it conflict with so many other record sources?

Before reaching a conclusion on the birth date of Rufus O. Hart, an analysis of the inconsistencies on his place of birth will be performed.

2.3 Birth Place Analysis

Record sources differ on the birthplace of Rufus O. Hart. Some indicate he was born in Randolph County, West Virginia, while others report the state of Kansas as his place of birth. The records containing the conflicting birth places do not correspond, like-to-like, with the records containing the conflicting birth dates, making it necessary to analyze the birth date and birth place independently.

A chronology of his family establishes their residence as Randolph County for the time periods prior and subsequent to his birth in the 1870/1871 timeframe:

- His parents were married in February 1868 in Randolph County, where they were both residents at the time.²⁶
- Their first child, Mabel, was born in February 1869 in Randolph County.²⁷
- Rufus was their second child.²⁸
- Their third child, Bertha, was born in February 1872 in Randolph County.²⁹

It seems unlikely that the family lived in Kansas for the short period of time between the birth of Mabel and Bertha. The 1870 census would provide some additional information on their whereabouts at that time, but the family is unidentified in that census.³⁰

The record sources reporting a Kansas birth for Rufus are:

- Three federal censuses (1880, 1900, and 1910)³¹
- His daughter's delayed birth certificate recorded in 1942³²
- An authored narrative written by that same daughter, which specifies Jackson County, Kansas as Rufus' birthplace.³³

None of these sources offers definitive primary information. The informant for the 1880 census was most likely Rufus' mother, and if so, his birth place would be primary information. Although the informants for the census records are unknown, they are clearly not one single individual because the 1880 census was enumerated when Rufus was a child living with his parents, while the later census records were enumerated when Rufus was married and living with his wife and children.

A search of online databases containing Kansas births and baptisms did not identify Rufus Hart.³⁴ However, Kansas did not mandate recording of vital records at that time, thus documented birth information is sparse and incomplete so this negative evidence is not conclusive. Also, there are additional sources of potential birth information for Kansas that were not researched due to time constraints.

The record sources reporting a West Virginia birth are:

- Rufus' death records (both the death certificate and the death register)³⁵
- His marriage record,³⁶ with the bride as informant
- The 1920 census³⁷
- The Randolph County birth register³⁸

The first three do not provide primary information. The Randolph County birth register for Rufus reports that he was born in Beverly, Randolph County, West Virginia. This would typically be reliable primary evidence for a birth place. However, as discussed in the previous section, this register is a derivative source containing undetermined information, recorded after the fact from assessor's documents, and it conflicts with several other record sources.

Resolving the conflict

It is possible that Rufus was born in Kansas in November 1870 while the family was there on an extended visit. Once back in West Virginia, the local assessor may have documented his birth in April of 1871 and the county clerk added it to the Randolph County birth register for that year. This would explain both the conflicting birth places and birth dates.

This hypothesis is strengthened by the correlation of the following pieces of indirect and negative evidence:

- Rufus' father, Alexander Pickens Hart, had a second cousin, Hugh See Hart, who lived in Kansas during that time period.³⁹ Hugh See Hart lived in Circleville, Jefferson Township, Jackson County, Kansas in 1870,⁴⁰ the same county reported as Rufus' birth location in *The Harts of Randolph*.⁴¹
- Rufus Oursler, a prominent citizen of Jackson County, Kansas and the founder of Circleville, lived there at the time of Rufus Ousler Hart's birth.⁴² Rufus' middle name of

Ousler is unusual and is not a family name found in previous generations.⁴³ It is likely that Rufus Ousler Hart was named for Rufus Oursler of Jackson County, Kansas, with a minor corruption in spelling.

- Cousin Hugh See Hart was a business partner with Rufus Oursler,⁴⁴ establishing a relationship between the Hart and Oursler families.
- Rufus Hart's family is unidentified in the 1870 census.⁴⁵ This may be due to the family's in-transit status between West Virginia and Kansas during that enumeration.

The sharing of an unusual name combination, along with the relationships and associations in the small town of Circleville, Kansas circa 1870 possibly tie Rufus' father to Jackson County, Kansas around the time of Rufus' birth. The family's absence in the Randolph County 1870 census records suggests they were elsewhere in the summer of 1870. Strengthening the case for a Kansas birth are the multiple independent sources reporting Kansas as Rufus' place of birth.

The two source records conflicting with the Kansas birth have already been shown to have questionable credibility. The birth register is a derivative document, copied from assessor's records after the fact. An out-of-state birth could have easily been misconstrued and recorded as a local birth. The death certificate has multiple informants and provides an inaccurate birth year, making the reported birth place questionable as well.

The conclusion reached is that Jackson County, Kansas is the birth place of Rufus O. Hart.

2.4 Birth Information Conclusions

The conclusion that Kansas is the birth place of Rufus O. Hart despite its conflict with the birth register, makes the birth register less creditable for the birth date of 07 April 1871 as well,

especially with the potential for errors if recording an out-of-state birth that occurred in the prior year. The preponderance of secondary/undetermined information of independent origin for the 07 November 1870 birth date strengthens the case for the 1870 birth date. Until additional research can be performed to pursue this further, the conclusion is that Rufus O. Hart was probably born 07 November 1870 in Jackson County, Kansas.

3 MARRIAGE ANALYSIS

4.2 Death Date Analysis

Record sources for Rufus O. Hart suggest three potential death dates:

- 06 April 1928
- 07 April 1928
- 06 April 1929

Both 1928 dates are supported by evidence from multiple sources. The 1929 date is documented solely in an authored narrative, *Pioneer Index of Randolph County, West Virginia.*⁴⁶ The author references her source as *Randolph County West Virginia Cemetery Headstone Readings, volume 1*, by the Allegheny Regional Family History Society. The 1929 death year is undoubtedly a typographical error, as the headstone clearly reports a 1928 date; therefore the 1929 death date is rejected.

The remaining two 1928 dates vary by only a day.

Support for the April 7 death date

The April 7 date is supported by Rufus' death certificate and death register.⁴⁷ The death register is in alphabetical order by the first letter of the surname, indicating it was copied from another source. Closer inspection of the death register suggests that it was copied from the death certificate, as it includes the date that the death certificate was filed by the registrar (01 May

1928). If so, the death register is not a source of independent origin, but a derivative source of information copied from the death certificate.

The death date recorded on a death certificate is generally considered primary information. On this death certificate it isn't clear who reported the date of date. It appears that many hands were involved in the completion of the death certificate:

- Rufus' son, John Hart, listed as the informant
- The person who typed parts of the death certificate, including death date
- The person who later wrote in the missing birth year and age in months/days
- The doctor who attended Rufus
- The registrar who received and filed the certificate

The date of death on the certificate was not completed by the doctor, as the following section of the death certificate shows.




Figure 1. Section of death certificate of Rufus Hart⁴⁸

The date of death is typed while the information completed by the doctor is handwritten. It isn't clear which one was completed first. If the doctor completed his part first, then the statement, "death occurred on the date stated above," would refer to a death date of April 06, and the typed date would be an error. If the doctor completed his part after the typist, then that statement would refer to a death date of April 07.

Based on the burial date of 08 April 1928, it is more likely that Rufus died on the sixth instead of the seventh, particularly with the time of death listed as 3:30 pm. Burial and funeral arrangements generally are not completed in less than 24 hours.

There are too many informants and other questionable pieces of information on this death certificate to accept the date of death at face value. No other independent sources report the same death date.

Support for the April 6 death date

The April 6 date is supported by Rufus' gravestone, and an authored narrative.⁴⁹ *The Harts of Randolph* was written by Rufus' daughter, Katherine Hart Frame, who was living at the time of her father's death, making her reported date of death for Rufus a primary source of information.

Summary

Based on the multiple informants for the death certificate, along with other questionable details, the death date provided on the death certificate is less credible than the one provided by the other sources. The conclusion is that Rufus O. Hart died on 06 April 1928.

4.3 Death Place Analysis

Record sources for Rufus O. Hart provide compatible evidence that he died in Randolph County, West Virginia.

4.4 Death Information Conclusions

Rufus O. Hart died on 06 April 1928 in Randolph County, West Virginia.
